Report of Continental TIP CSL 8th Asian Continental Championships Shueili Taiwan - 15th to 27th May 2013



A. Talent ID camp overview

1. Organization

The planed number of athletes for the camp was 12 as a usual TIP Continental camp. Otherwise, when all teams concerned by the Asia development were there, the ICF group was brought up to 24 as follow:

- Thailand: 3 TIP plus the 6 national paddlers. Agreement suggested and done with the Thailand head coach and Herman Husslein
- Singapore: 1 TIP plus the 2 national paddlers. Agreement suggested and done with the Singapore team leader
- Malaysia: 1 TIP plus the 2 national paddlers. Agreement suggested and done with the Malaysia team leader
- Kazakhstan: 2 TIP
- Korea: 3 TIP plus 1 national paddler. Agreement suggested and done with the Korea team leader and national coach Carles Juanmarti
- Hong-Kong: 1 national paddler. Agreement suggested and done with the concerned paddler
- Chinese Taipei: no TIP was sent to the camp. 3 TPE paddlers not selected in their national team were invited under the request of the Taichung team head coach

Some paddlers from Hong-Kong, Thailand, Singapore, Korea and Chinese Taipei were true beginners (1st time on white-water).

2. Coaching

Regards to the high number of paddlers, the continental and ICF coaches (Shuji Yamanaka and Pierrick Gosselin) could not coach the whole group alone. Herman Husslein (THA) and Carles Juanmarti (KOR) joined the coaching crew. The cooperation and communication were easy and smooth.
