15. Bib Distribution

A. Canoe Slalom Events

- CSL Competition bibs will be available from the Sport Information Office from 09.30 on the Friday 06.11.2020.
- A bib deposit of 100 Euro per set per nation is required on collection of the bibs.
- Training bibs must be return at this time.
- CSL Competition bibs must be returned to the Sport Information Office following the competition for the return of the deposit.
- The bibs are allocated in the following way:

MK1	Brown	WC1	blue
WK1	Purple	MC1	grey

16. Canoe Slalom events – race information

A. Pre start procedure

- There will be a clock facing upstream into the warm up area showing race time and the next athletes to start.
- There will be no pre-start.

B. Start



- Athletes may move to the start position once the previous Athlete has broken the beam but must be at the start position 15 seconds before their start.
- The starting boat must be alongside the pontoon in front of the partners panel.
- The beam line is under the bridge.
- At the start, there will be a countdown clock showing the time to start. There will be an acoustic signal (10 seconds before start - 4 shorts, 1 long - start).
- Athletes must start **within 3 seconds of** their start time:



Red light → the athlete **can't** leave the start position



Green light → the athlete **can** leave the start position

- At all times, the athletes must follow the Starter's instruction, or they may be disqualified for the run.

C. Finish



- The beam line will be indicated by two flags “FFCK” and 2 banners “finish”.
- Athletes must exit via the ponton (right side of the finish pool) to pass through equipment control, kiss and cry and the mixed zone.
- Athletes must not leave the finish zone until dismissed by the Equipment Control Judge once they are no longer needed for the ceremonies, anti-doping or equipment control.
- During the finals, the leading athlete (**first one**) must proceed to the “Kiss and Cry” area located after equipment control where TV will interview them.
- There will be access to the broadcast feed in this area. If the athlete drops out of the lead the new leader will replace them.
- They then proceed via the mixed zone back to the Athlete area.

17. Extreme Canoe Slalom events – race information

A. Start list review & competition format

B. Final phases Extreme Canoe Slalom Events

- For time trials, bibs will be the same as for Canoe Slalom events.
- For CSLX final phases bibs will be distributed in the start area on the left bank just before the start.

C. Pre-start procedure

- Athletes need to be at the start area 30 minutes prior to their heats to prepare their boats and receive their bibs and final instructions.
- Athletes may warm up in their own CSLX or a CSLX boat provided by the organiser.
- Access to start ramp will be on the right bank.

D. Start Procedure

- Athletes should be settled in the start position on the ramp 1.5 minutes before their start time.
- They should then listen to the sports presentation where they will be introduced to spectators.
- During this time, they should face the TV camera. At all times they should follow the starters instructions.
- The start position is with paddle in one hand to allow athlete to push off to start.
- Boats will be held at the start position.

E. Finish

- Finish line for time trials will be the same as for the Canoe Slalom events.
- Finish line for final phases will be indicated on the course map.
- After the finish please go to the dedicated area indicated on the course design map.
- Wait there for 30 secs to gather with other paddlers from your run (for TV) and then exit to kiss and cry zone – there will be someone to let you know if you were qualified for next phase.
- Please return the boat, spraydeck and bib to the start via the left bank.

- Volunteers will be there to help you.

Rules reminder

Gate negotiation

16.21.3 - The whole head and both shoulders of the athlete must cross the gate line in accordance with the correct side of the gate and the course plan.

Safety rules

16.25.1 - Athletes are not permitted to push or hold back other athletes or kayaks with their hands or paddles.

16.25.2 - Kayak to kayak contact is permitted but athletes are not permitted to ram their boats into another athletes body.

16.25.3 - Athletes are not permitted to deliberately reach across another Athletes body with their paddle.

Priority is always given to the boat in front.

18. Technical Video Service

- A TVS feed will be available for all competitions and both demonstration runs.
