9. Official Accommodations

9.1 Hotels SHA++

For carefree and highest COVID-19 safeguard during your stays, two official accommodations listed below are designated as official accommodation for your choice. These hotels are SHA extra plus (SHA++) certified and conformed to the government regulations for Test & Go scheme.

9.2 Fee Packages

The fee packages below are applied to both hotels.

Single Room	USD 140/person/night plus USD 160/person for two (2) RT-PCR tests on Day 1 and Day 5 (The test will be done at the hotel)
Twin-room sharing	USD 100/person/night plus USD 160/person for two (2) RT-PCR tests on Day 1 and Day 5 (The test will be done at the hotel)

9.3 Official Airport Transfer and Fares

After the immigration process completed at the Suvarnabhumi International Airport, all teams must be transferred to the pre-booked hotel immediately on the sealed route vehicle as part of the Test & Go scheme. Please meet at Gate 10 for pick-up. Two types of vehicles are prepared to cater an appropriate number of passengers, their bags and luggage only.

- Bus (for 9 up to 36 passengers) - The fare is USD 80/pax/round trip*
- Van (for 4 passengers) - The fare is USD 60/pax/round trip*

* Round trip means transport of passengers between the hotel and the Suvarnabhumi International Airport and vice versa on the arrival and the departure days.

Boats are not allowed on the passenger vehicles. As thus, the team who wish to bring your own boats as loaded luggage please inform the HOC in advance to arrange the transportation (extra cost applied).

9.4 Hotel and Airport Transfer Reservation

10. Visa Requirements and Thailand Pass

10.1 Visa

Upon request, the HOC will issue an official invitation to athletes and team officials from National Federations where visas are required. For so doing, a copy of passport of each of the team members must be submitted together with the request to the HOC **within 10 February 2022** via email: 2022ACSL.HOC@gmail.com for further internal process.

10.2 Thailand Pass

All team members MUST register to a Thailand Pass under the Test & Go scheme by yourself at <https://tp.consular.go.th/>. The system has been reopened from 1 February 2022 at 09:00 hrs. Thailand time. For those who need visas to enter Thailand, please register once your visas has been granted.

Thailand Pass system is a free-of-charge web-based QR code generating system in support of the "Ease of Travel" for travelers during the COVID-19 pandemic situation. It will collect both travel and health information and help facilitates the filing of the arrival card (TM6) and T8 Forms (*see appendix*). To obtain a QR entry code or Thailand Pass ID, you will have to:

- Register at Thailand Pass web portal
- Input personal details
- Upload the required documents:
 1. Passport
 2. Vaccination Certificate or Card
 3. Insurance Certificate, expressly state that USD 50,000 coverage on medical expenses and COVID-19 and must cover the whole length of stay in Thailand
 4. Confirmed SHA++ hotel booking with two RT-PCR tests on Day 1 and Day 5
 5. Flight booking
- Receive a confirmation email after registration (within seconds after registration)
- Wait for the Thailand Pass approval (within an hour or up to 7 days)

11. COVID-19 Protocol for Athletes and Team Officials

11.1 Eligible Travelers

- COVID-19 vaccinated athletes and team officials no less than 14 days and no more than 12 months before arrival in Thailand
- from all countries/territories

11.2 Number of Team Officials Accompanying the Team

- Limited to two team officials per a national team to lower the dense at the venue

11.3 Mode of Travel and Point of Arrival

- Arrival by air to the Suvarnabhumi International Airport
- Transferred to the pre-booked accommodations by prearranged bus or van on point-to-point basis

11.4 Pre-Arrival Requirements

Make sure that the teams have the following documents for entering Thailand.

1. A Thailand Pass, which can be applied via <https://tp.consular.go.th/>. The system will reopen for new TEST & Go applications from 1 February 2022 (09:00 hrs. Thailand time)
2. A Medical Certificate with an RT-PCR lab result indicating that COVID-19 is not detected issued no more than 72 hours before travelling.
3. An insurance policy with COVID-19 infection liability coverage no less than US\$ 50,000. The policy should cover the cost of treatment and other medical expenses associated with being infected with COVID-19, including in-patient hospitalization, hospital isolation, hotel isolation, or related quarantine. The insurance policy should also cover the whole duration that the teams are planning to stay plus at least 10 extra days as a precautionary measure in the event that the second swab test result returns positive. In case the policy is not covered, the contacted patient must be fully responsible for all expenses incurred thereof.
4. A proof of prepayment for 2 separate nights of a selected accommodation (*see item 9. Official Accommodation*) and the expenses for 2 RT-PCR tests on Day 1 and Day 5.
5. A Certificate of COVID-19 Vaccination/Recovery
 - All team members must be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 with an approved vaccine at least 14 days before travelling to Thailand.
 - Any member/s of the team/s with history of COVID-19 infection who have recovered by medical treatment, and those who have received at least 1 dose of an approved vaccine after post-infection must have certificate of COVID-19 recovery.
6. All team members must undergo 'exit screening' at the point of departure, i.e., at the airline check-in counter and present the required documents to the person-in-charge to carry out the checks.

11.5 At Point of Arrival and During the Stays Requirements

1. All members of the teams must undergo 'entry screening' including body temperature check at the point of entry

2. Present the required documents to the Immigration/Health Control officer to carry out the checks, then proceed through the immigration procedures.
3. Proceed to the prearranged accommodation to undergo the first RT-PCR test. The trip must be by the prearranged vehicle on a sealed route. Then, all team members must wait for the test result within the hotel only.
4. On Day 5, all team members must stay within the hotel to undergo the second RT-PCR test. You can be out again once the test result issued as 'not detected'. This usually takes no more than 24 hours.
5. Any member/s of the team/s whose test result returns positive will be referred for appropriate medical treatment in accordance with Thailand's Communicable Disease ACT B.E. 2558 (2015). The expenses must be covered by the required insurance policy.
 - Pending on their conditions, they may be medically advised to receive treatment in either hospital, hotel isolation or community isolation.
 - During receiving the medical treatment – at least 10 days. They must remain in their accommodation only. They should not leave their accommodation unless utmost necessary and must notify the Communicable Disease Control officer in-charge.
 - After having recovered from COVID-19, they will receive a medical certificate of recovery.
6. While in Thailand, all team members are advised to strictly follow standard, good personal hygiene practices; such as, wear a mask in public, maintain hand hygiene (washing with soap and water or using hand sanitizer), and keep physical distance at least 1 metre from others.
 - Any team member who is experiencing COVID-like symptoms must report to the medical service center at the venue to get a test and an appropriate medical treatment if deemed necessary.
7. All team members must download and install Mor-Chana application, and set it on at all times for the COVID-19 precautionary measures and to record the result on Day 5 in the application.



12. Guidelines for International Departure

For international departure, it is the responsibilities of an athlete or the team to make sure that the travelers meet the requirement of their specific international destination regardless of the point of departure.

Any team who needs the **pre-departure RT-PCR test at your own responsibility**, please contact the HOC upon your arrival for prearranged appointment and prepayment. The test will be done 48 - 72 hours prior to your departure date at the hotel/certified clinic and hospital up to your medical advice and the result will be issued the following day of the test.
