14. Race information

A. Course design timetable

- The Kayak Cross course map will be distributed from the Race Office and a link will be spread on the What's app group on Wednesday 14/06/2023 at 10.00.
- The Canoe and Kayak Course maps (Heats & Semi-final/Final) will be distributed on Wednesday 14/06/2023 at 20:00.

B. Bibs distribution

o Full list of the bibs/event is at Appendix 3

- CSL Competition bibs will be available from the Race Office from 14.00 on Wednesday 14/06/2023 (100 euros deposit requested).
- Bibs need to be returned after the events.
- For Kayak Cross Time Trials bibs will be picked up at the Race office from 16:00 on Saturday.

For Elimination phases the bibs will be distributed individually at the start area.

In each bracket Athletes will also place over their number bib a colour bib to
designate their ranking in the time trial. These bibs will change around depending
on who proceeds and will be distributed directly before each bracket by the pre
start Judges. Athletes must return the coloured bibs to the dedicated HOC volunteer
at the finish take out after their run.

- o Highest ranked = Red
- o 2nd ranked = Green
- o 3^{rd} ranked = Blue
- o 4th ranked = Yellow





C. Canoe and Kayak events

1. Pre-start procedure

• There will be a clock facing the river (warm-up area) on the river right showing the race time and the next athletes to start.

2. Start






- Athletes may move to the start position once the previous Athlete has broken the beam but must be at the start position 15 seconds before their start.
- The start is located in the left directly above the entrance to the drop
- Athletes must start facing upstream in front of the backdrop.
- At the start, there will be a countdown clock showing the time to start. There will be an acoustic signal (10 seconds before start 4 shorts, 1 long start).
- Athletes may start 5 seconds either side of their official start time which is signified by the long beep on the start clock.







- The beam line is located 2.5 meters downstream of the start position.
- At all times, the athletes must follow the Starter's instruction, or they may be disqualified for the run.

3. Finish

- The finish beam is located at the end of the artificial course, just before the drop to the river
- The beam line is indicated by banners on each side of the channel.



- Athletes must exit via steps at the end of the course and pass through equipment control, and the mixed zone. During the finals, the three first athletes must proceed to the "Kiss and Cry" area located after equipment control where they will be interviewed.
- Athletes must not leave the finish zone until dismissed by the Equipment Control
 Judge once they are no longer needed for the ceremonies, anti-doping or
 equipment control.
- Athletes should wear their Competition bib in the mixed zone for identification purposes.





D. Kayak Cross events

1. Start & Finish line

- An automatic start machine will be used for all phases. The machine will trigger the timing for the Time trial (when the platform starts to move).
- The finish for Time Trials will be triggered by photocell.

 During the Elimination phase a photo finish system will be deployed

2. Pre-start procedure

- Athletes need to be at the start area prior to their start to prepare their boats, and receive any final instructions.
- All the equipment will be checked in the pre-start area (boat, paddle, helmets, buoyancy aid). Gauges can be buy to the ICF (5€ cash).

3. Start procedure

- At all times the athletes should follow the starters instructions.
- The start position is with both hands on the paddle and the paddle in a horizontal position along the side of the kayak.



- The signal to start will be "Ready" after a random period the platform will tilt.
- The starter will not say "Go".





Time trials


- Athletes must start from <u>lane 2</u> on the platform for the Time Trials
- Start interval is short, athletes should get in their boat behind lane 3 and 4. They will then be assisted to move to the start lane.

Elimination phases

- Athletes should be settled in the start position on the ramp 90 seconds before their start time. There will be volunteers to assist them if needed.
- They should then listen to the sports presentation where they will be introduced to spectators.

4. Finish

The finish beam is located in the middle of the pool below the bridge.



- The takeout is either on the right bank after the finish line or at Canoe Slalom take out at the end of the competition channel.
- In the Elimination phase, the athlete must return their coloured bibs to the volunteer at the finish River left after the finish line before to move down.
- No shuttle here to assist
- Progression information will be given





5. Rules reminder

- Minimum boat weight 18kg. Random pre competition Control during Time Trial.
 Elimination phase is pre competition control.
- Helmets must be on the ICF list, (ICF has a few helmets to loan) see:

- All buoyancy must above the waist, meet EN norms see:
 https://www.canoeicf.com/sites/default/files/2022 extreme kayak buoyancy rules v1.pdf
- No sharp edges on the paddle. Blades must be 5 mm thick (all around the blade).
 Possible to buy gauges to pre check.
- In Time trial and Elimination Athletes must wear long sleeves
- If an athlete or their equipment falls from the platform before the "ready" = DNS. They must exit from the start platform or the course.
- No movement between "Ready" and the tilt of the Start machine, otherwise False start = FLT.
- Whole head and both shoulders must cross the gate line in the correct direction.
- It not permitted to move the gates in an unfair way to disadvantage others = RAL
- Athletes are permitted to "reach across" but not hold back.
- An Athlete with a broken paddle must drop back and paddle down the course alone. If they do not, the broken end of the paddle is considered dangerous = RAL. They may drop the broken paddle and use their hands to finish the course.
- Using a photo finish to break tie in the elimination phase this is measured on the bow of the boat.

For Vote at this meeting

Interval during time trials

Existing rules:

10.2.1 - In individual events, starts are separated by at least forty-five seconds.

The proposal is to use a 40 sec interval. This was accepted at the meeting.





E. Technical Video Service

- A TVS feed will be available for all events and demonstration runs.
- Only the download solution will be available. Each Nation needs to supply a 20m cable to connect to the closest switch for the download solution.
- Please enable the option "Automatic (DHCP)"
- Address to use to download videos: http://cis.siwi
- Be aware the first access to http://cis.siwi may take a bit longer, sometimes 1-2 min.
- It is important the WLAN is not activated (off) not only "not connected" to a WLANnetwork.
- All devices must be connected at the testing time, 16:00 Wednesday
 07/06/2023, so we know the system works under the full load.
- Wireless routers may be used if they are **NOT** within the following frequencies:

5785 GHz, band width +/- 20 MHz 5825 GHz, band width +/- 20 MHz

Any wireless device in these frequencies may affect the delivery of the competition.

- At no time should any wireless router system be connected to the computer which is connected to the TVS Lan cable.
- All devices, including any wireless routers, must be named with National Federation code and device number eg AUS1, AUS2, AUS3 – unnamed devices will be removed from the system.
- Any team found to be using a device affecting the competition will have power removed to their compete system.
- For any assistance, please contact Hans Peter WEISS , ICF TVS Co-ordinator.
- Teams can get access to a live Youtube feed (one device only) during the competition. Before each day of the competition, the links of the sessions will be sent to a unique representative of the registered federations.

15. Key areas during competition

See venue map attached in Appendix 1

A. Enquiry / Protest desk

The Enquiry desk is located by the bunker at the beginning of the course.

B. Equipment control

- Equipment Control is located near the finish line.
- Self-checking is open: Wednesday 14/06/2023 from 9:00 to 19:30.
- Emergency self-checking: Equipment control will be open each day 1h before the 1st boat starts.
- There will be post competition control and random checking during the whole competition.

C. Medals ceremonies

- Location: podium on the right bank, in the middle of the course
- Schedule: see competition schedule, after each session of final
- Athletes involved in the Finals for both Canoe Slalom and Kayak Cross should bring their national uniform to the medal ceremony preparation area. There is only a short time between the end of the competition and the medal ceremonies.

D. Doping control station

- The doping control station is located near the Club house at the start of the course.
- Athletes will be notified for Doping Control in the finish zone.
- Passports are required for Athletes selected for doping control.

E. National Federations parking

 Car parking for Teams is located in the field near the main entrance, behind the club; Teams 1 for trailers / Teams 2 and 3 behind the Tennis field. Parking pass is required, pick it up at the Race office.







F. Access to the left bank

 During the racing days access to the left side of the course is only for the judges, organisers, team leaders and persons with the video upgrade card (Video) attached to their accreditations.

16. Venue - Accreditation and security

Accreditation to the Venue

Access control from Wednesday 14/06/2023

o **Security**

- There is 24h security from Friday 09/06/2023.
- The Organising Committee recommends not leaving anything valuable in the tents, the cars or at the competition venue.
- The Organising Committee will not accept liability in case of theft or disappearance of equipment from the site.

17. Green Box - Athlete's video for sport presentation

The ICF will shoot a video (8s without sound) of athletes for sport presentation.

Athletes, who have not yet had a video taken, (they have been advised of this directly) should attend this short shooting session (maximum 2 minutes) in national uniform.

Any other Athletes are welcome to update their video if they wish, when the studio is open and not too busy

The Green Box studio will be on the top floor of the "Tower" and is open on Thursday from 08:30 to 12:00.
