Both these competitions earn ICF world ranking points in Canoe & Kayak and the Kayak Cross events.

Note, these competitions also incorporate selection trials for the Australian Senior, Under 23 and Junior National Teams Canoe Slalom.

DOPING CONTROL

In line with the World Anti-Doping Code and the ICF Doping Control Rules, Sport Integrity Australia (SIA) may conduct random drug testing at this competition.

All competing Athletes and Team Staff are also required to complete the ADEL doping education program, or national equivalent. If your Athlete has not yet completed this they should go to <https://www.canoeicf.com/anti-doping-education> and complete either the Athlete or coaches' education program.

ENTRIES

The entry fees are:

2026 Penrith Open AUD \$115 per Athlete with no limit on the Canoe & Kayak or Kayak Cross events entered.

2026 Australian Open AUD \$115 per Athlete with no limit on the Canoe & Kayak or Kayak Cross events entered.

Entry to both Penrith and the Australian Open is AUD \$190 per Athlete with no limit on the Canoe & Kayak or Kayak Cross events entered.

2026 Penrith and Australian Open entries are open from Monday 15 December 2025 with payments to be made via “JustGo”

Australian Athletes - Paddle Australia “JustGo” entry portal closes **30 January**

International Athletes - ICF SDP entries close on **3 February**

2026 Australian Open entries

- Paddle Australia “JustGo” entry portal closes **6 February**
- ICF SDP entries close on **10 February**

All entries must be made by your Federation using the ICF online entry system - SDP.

Australian athletes must complete their initial entry via the PA entry portal on “JustGo” before PA can submit your entry to the ICF via SDP.

Please contact PA directly if you are having problems using the JustGo entry system.

Acceptance of a late entry is at the discretion of the Organiser, and a late entry fee will be charged. Late entries must comply with ICF Canoe Slalom competition rule 1.6.1.f and Chapter 6.2 (2025 rules) regarding late entries.

COMPETITION RULES

The competitions will be run in accordance with ICF Rules and appendices in place at the time of the competition, and any special PA rules or bylaws as they pertain to the competition.

The 2025 rules and appendices are available from the ICF website at <https://www.canoeicf.com/rules - slalom>. 2026 Rules and appendices will be posted to the same address in January.

COMPETITION FORMAT

The following events and age groups will be contested at both the Penrith and the Australian Open:

Canoe & Kayak: Open, U23 and Junior (U18) in Men K1, Women K1, Men C1 and Women C1

Kayak Cross: Open and U18 in MX1 and WX1.

For both competitions Canoe / Kayak and Kayak Cross events will be staged over 3 days according to the following schedule:

Thursday	Demonstration Runs
Friday	Canoe Day: Heats: WC1, MC1 (one run) and finals
Saturday	Kayak Day: Heats: WK1, MK1 (one run) and finals
Sunday	Kayak Cross Qualification and Elimination rounds

All Competitors will have one heats qualification run and will be ranked. Based on the ranking of the first qualification run, the 12 best ranked competitors will progress directly to the Final.

If there are less entries in the Heats phase than qualify for the Final phase the Heats phase will still run to meet Australian Team selection criteria.

For Kayak Cross:

Athletes will compete in the Qualification round (time trial individual) and from this the first 32 ranked Athletes in MX1 and WX1 will proceed to the Elimination round

INVITATIONAL EVENTS

An B Final Invitation event will be held for Athletes who do not qualify for the Final.

ICF WORLD RANKING

All Athletes will progress through each phase of competition for all events according to the 2026 ICF progressions, available on the ICF website (see COMPETITION RULES in this document).

All competing Athletes will receive ICF world ranking points based on their final result. Note the B Final events do not count for Word Ranking points

COURSE CONFIGURATION

The course configuration will not be changed between the Penrith and Australian Open, but the Canoe Slalom competitions may be run on different parts of the channel.

The parts of the channel to be used for each competition will be confirmed by the 20 January 2025 but will likely be:

Penrith Open: "Sweet Lips" to the end of the channel (Olympic finish)

Australian Open: Start Pool to the bottom bridge

Kayak Cross: Start Ramp to "Jacks"

COURSE DESIGN

The Course Design Committee will be selected from those in the pool nominated by PA. Any International team wishing to submit a nomination to the pool must do so before 31 January to be considered.
