2 GENERAL INFORMATION

2.1 Province and City

2.1.1 Sichuan Province

Situated in southwest China and on the upper reaches of the Yangtze River, Sichuan is renowned as the "Land of Abundance". It covers an area of 486,000 square kilometres and borders with seven provinces (including autonomous regions and municipalities directly under the central government), namely, Chongqing, Guizhou, Yunnan, Xizang, Qinghai, Gansu, and Shaanxi. The province has a permanent resident population of over 83 million.

Boasting a long history, Sichuan is the cradle of ancient Shu civilisation, and the place where "Jiaozi", the earliest banknote in the world, was born. Shu Brocade and Sichuan Shadow Play have been included in UNESCO's list of intangible cultural heritage. In particular, the sites of Sanxingdui Site and Jinsha Site epitomise the resplendent and mysterious civilisation of ancient Sichuan.

The province also abounds in tourism resources. Among the 26 global tourism resources and brands, there are 3 World Natural Heritage Sites including Jiuzhaigou Valley, Huanglong Scenic and Historic Interest Area and Sichuan Giant Panda Sanctu-









aries, 1 World Cultural Heritage Site (Mount Qingcheng and the Dujiangyan Irrigation System), and 1 World Cultural and Natural Heritage Site (Mount Emei and Leshan Giant Buddha Scenic Area).

Sichuan is active in external exchanges. As of December 2024, it has established friendly relations with 500 provinces/states in 87 countries/regions, and economic and trade relations with over 200 countries/regions. A total of 381 Fortune Global 500 Enterprises have operated in Sichuan. Chengdu, the capital of Sichuan Province, is among the Chinese cities offering a 240-hour visa-free transit policy for travellers from 54 countries.

2.1.2 Chengdu

2.1.2.1 Basic information

Chengdu is the hometown of the Giant Pandas and enjoys over 4,500 years of civilisation history and more than 2,300 years of history as a city, manifesting a perfect mixture of history, culture and modernity. Being the capital of Sichuan Province and a central city in southwest China, Chengdu covers an area of 14,300 square kilometres and has a permanent population of 21.4 million, which has turned it into a megacity known to the world. It is also an important centre of economy, science and technology, finance, cultural creativity, and international exchanges in China, and an international hub for comprehensive transportation and communications.

Today's Chengdu values opening up with global vision. In total, 23 countries have been approved to establish consulates in Chengdu. And the city has established sister-city and friendship city relations with 113 cities around the world, and trade relations with 235 countries/regions worldwide. Chengdu is the third city having two international airports on the Chinese mainland, following Shanghai and Beijing, and the 19th

city with two 4F airports in the world. In 2024, the passenger throughput exceeded 87 million. As of December 2024, it has opened 73 regular international and regional flight routes, covering both passenger and freight services. In addition, it is linked to 118 overseas cities through its international freight train services.

Chengdu has been awarded as the City of Gastronomy by UN-ESCO for its world-renowned Sichuan cuisine, great variety of delicious street food, and tasty spicy hot pot. It is also selected by UNWTO as China's Best Tourist City. Tianfu culture, the bedrock of Chengdu's city culture, has been nourishing the people and the city with the spirits of valuing innovation, creativity, elegance, fashion, optimism, inclusiveness, friendship, and public welfare. Chengdu has successfully held the Chengdu FISU World University Games, the Thomas & Uber Cup Finals 2024, among other major international events. Culture and sports have become the two focal points as Chengdu is going global in a more open and confident manner.

2.1.3 Geography and Climate

2.1.3.1 Climate

Located in Sichuan Basin, Chengdu has a monsoon-influenced humid subtropical climate characterised by mild weather with no extreme heat in summer, rare ice and snow in winter, plenty of precipitation in autumn and at night, and low-speed winds and high relative humidity. On average annually, the city has a temperature of 16.7°C, a precipitation of 948.6mm, and humidity of 80%.

2.1.3.2 Weather in August

TWG 2025 Chengdu will be held during the height of summer in Chengdu, the period featuring the highest temperature, most precipitation, and most severe convective weather in the year.

During this period, there may be major meteorological disasters with great impacts, including high temperature, rainstorm, strong wind, hail, thunderstorm, as well as secondary disasters such as mountain torrents, floods in small and medium-sized rivers, geological disasters, and urban water logging caused by heavy rainfall.

Chengdu is relatively hot from early-August to mid-August, with abundant precipitation and high humidity. This period sees few haze, high visibility, relatively low average wind speeds, and occasional convective weather.

a. Temperature

During this period, the average temperature is 25.8°C, and the difference between day and night is about 8.5°C. The temperature usually remains stable, with the highest daytime temperature ranging from 31°C to 39°C. The average number of days with temperatures exceeding 35°C is 2, while the maximum is 16 (2022 and 2024).

b. Precipitation and humidity

Chengdu receives abundant rainfall during this period, mostly at night while only a little in the daytime that lasts only one to three hours. The average precipitation is 164.3 mm. It is expected that heavy rains severely impacting the competition will not occur frequently. The humidity ranges from 48% to 100%, with 82.4% on average.

c. Wind

This period is often wind-free or sees low-speed winds, with an average wind speed of 1.2 m/s. Northerly wind or northeasterly wind prevails, with the lowest wind speeds occurring from 00:00 to 08:00. Winds gather speed at noon and slow down in the evening. Convective gusts occur occasionally for a very short duration, usually within 30 minutes.

d. Visibility

During this period, the visibility is relatively high and there is little fog. The horizontal visibility ranges from 2.6 km to 28.2 km, with an average of 20.8 km.

3.1.4 Detail

24-hour arrival/departure services at Tianfu Airport, Shuangliu Airport, and Chengdudong Railway Station. Service desks and dedicated drop-off/pick-up points will be established.

International Flights (Tianfu Airport): Arrival: Dedicated or priority customs and immigration channels. Departure: Dedicated check-in counters and dedicated or priority customs, immigration, and security channels.

Domestic Flights (Tianfu/Shuangliu Airports): Priority check-in counters and security channels.

Chengdudong Railway Station: Signage/staff guidance to dedicated drop-off/pick-up areas.

3.1.5 Customs Clearance Services and Tips

Chengdu ExCo will provide a range of services to facilitate customs clearance for participants' supplies and equipment. We will set up a customs clearance service team, recommend professional customs clearance service providers for selection, and offer necessary tariff guarantee services for temporarily imported supplies and equipment. Participants are required to fill in the information about supplies and equipment on the Chengdu 2025 APP no later than three months prior to TWG 2025 Chengdu. For the specific procedures on transporting TWG-related supplies and equipment to Chengdu, please refer to the Customs Clearance Service Guide issued by the Chengdu ExCo (https://www.theworldgames2025.com/activity/ fisu?lang=zh&cid=delegation). For media carrying the reporting and photographic equipment as carry-on luggage when entering China, ATA Carnet is recommended for the customs clearance.

3.3 Accommodation

3.3.1 Accommodation Arrangement for Athletes of 34 Sports

The TWG Village will commence operation and provide services at 00:00 on August 3, 2025, and cease operation and terminate service at 24:00 on August 18, 2025. No services will be provided before 00:00 on August 3, 2025 and after 24:00 on August 18, 2025.

3.3.1.1 Accommodation Allotment Plan by Sports Canoe will be assigned accommodation in TWG Village Zone A.

3.4 Catering Services

For sports requiring provision of meals before 06:00 or after 23:00 due to time constraints to meet competition schedules, competition managers or representatives of relevant sports may book such a service 24 hours in advance at the Athlete Dining Hall service counter, specifying headcount and timing. Meals will be provided accordingly.

3.4.1.2

Complimentary refreshments and drinking water will be provided at competition venues per competition schedule. Instant noodles and RTE meat products will be provided for those unable to return to TWG Village for meals due to time constraints to meet competition schedule. Complimentary drinking water will be provided at competition venues as per training schedule. 3.4.1.3

During Athletes' Night, a complimentary buffet will be pro-









vided. The menu will include sandwiches, RTE meat products, bread, pastries, juices, and other energy-packed foods. 3.4.1.4

Complementary meal bags and drinking water will be provided for athletes and officials attending the opening and closing ceremonies.

3.5 Transport

3.5.1 Service Hours and Scope

The dedicated transport service for TWG 2025 Chengdu shall operate from 3 to 18 August 2025 (16 days). Services include arrival and departure transport, Opening and Closing Ceremonies transport, competition and training transport, and official events transport.

3.5.2 Competition and Training Transport

Scheduled shuttle services (in principle coaches) will be provided between TWG Village Zone A / Zone B and competition venues based on the pre-determined competition and training schedules. For athletes requiring accessible transportation, scheduled accessible shuttle services will be provided.

Athletes' Training Shuttles: Arrive at the venue 30 minutes before the training and depart within 30 minutes after the training. Athletes' Competition Shuttles: The shuttle schedule will be based on the competition schedule for different sports. In principle the first shuttle arrives 2 hours before the competition; the last shuttle departs 2 hours after the competition. Back-up vehicles will be provided for those who miss shuttles due to doping control test, interviews and other unforeseen circumstances.

Technical Officials' Shuttles: The shuttle schedule will be based on the competition schedule for different sports. The first shuttle arrives at the venue 1.5 to 2 hours before the competition, and the last shuttle departs 2 hours after the competition.

3.5.3 Official Events Transport

Scheduled shuttle services (coaches) will be provided between TWG Village Zone A / Zone B and TWG Plaza for participants to take part in activities held in TWG Plaza and Athletes' Night.

3.5.4 Other Transportation Services

Vehicle rental information and complimentary public transportation will be provided during the Games.

3.6 Insurance

3.6.1 Minimum Medical Insurance Coverage Required for Participants

Cost of Insurance for Participants Without or With Insufficient Insurance Upon Arrival

Chengdu ExCo offers the following insurance options for participants upon arrival in Chengdu: accidental death/disability insurance (CNY 1,000,000), accidental injury medical insurance (CNY 1,000,000), acute illness death insurance (CNY 500,000), acute illness medical insurance (CNY 1,000,000), and emergency repatriation insurance (CNY 1,000,000). The premium is CNY 280 per person per day. Discounts apply based on coverage duration (see detailed pricing below). Insurance consultations and sales are available at the Participant Services Centre in TWG Village.

3.7 Medical Services

Chengdu ExCo will offer complimentary on-site medical treatment and emergency medical transfer services to all accredited participants during the Games.

3.8 Anti-Doping

3.8.1 Doping Control

The IWGA is committed to delivering a world-class anti-doping programme during TWG 2025 and has the authority to test athletes anytime and anywhere within the context of the Event. The IWGA has delegated the independent management of TWG 2025 anti-doping programme to the International Testing Agency (ITA). The China Anti-Doping Agency (CHINADA) will be responsible for the sample collection. Both urine and/or blood samples will be collected. All samples will be analyzed at the Sports Medicine Research & Testing WADA accredited laboratory in Beijing (CHINA). Please visit https://theworldgames.org/ (Athletes & Clean Sport section) for more detailed information regarding the anti-doping programme (including but not limited to WADA Prohibited list 2025, testing procedures, anti-doping rule violations, Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUE), REVEAL-whistleblowing platform. All athletes are encouraged to participate in education activities delivered by the ITA and CHINADA during Games time.

4 COMPETITION INFORMATION

4.1 Canoe Marathon

4.1.1 Format

4.1.1.1 Short Distance

- -20 competitors are split into two groups of ten per heat.
- -Five fastest competitors in each heat qualify for the finals.-Additional five best boats of both races qualify for the final (15 in total).
- -The best three paddlers in the Finals will receive the Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal.
- -In the Short Distance, all boats line up at the starting line and use a stationary start. Athletes alternate paddling with their boat on water and portaging their boat on a pontoon.
- -Short distance will be about 3,5 km. The distance is composed of three small laps (approx. 1.0 km each lap, first portage is af-









ter appr. 1500 m) including two portages. The last lap is slightly shorter. Paddled anti clockwise




Figure 2 Short distance course

4.1.1.2 Long Distance

- 20 Competitors in men and women.
- The best three paddlers will receive the Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal.

Long distance will be 21,5 km long and will have 8 portages, paddled anti-clockwise.

The distance consists of 10 big laps (2 km) including eight portages (no portages in the first three big laps measured from the start, first portage is after about 6500m), and small lap after the portage (1000m) with 2 turning points to the finish. Paddled anti clockwise.

The boats have finished the race when their bows cross the finish line, with the athlete in the boat.

Due to weather conditions (very severe high temperatures (around 40 degrees) and other circumstances, the long distance races may be adjusted.




Figure 3 Long distance course

4.1.2 Competition Rules

The canoe marathon events will be organized in accordance with the latest ICF competition rules. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be regarded as authoritative.

4.1.2.1 Disqualification and Penalties

1. Any athlete who attempts to compete in a race by any other than honourable means or who breaks the racing rules, or who disregards the honourable nature of the racing rules will be penalized or disqualified for the duration of the race concerned.

2.Should an athlete have failed to follow the correct course of the race (for example missed a turning buoy) the athlete has broken the racing rules will be subject to a penalty:

If the Race Umpire believes the athlete has gained a small advantage on other athletes, time penalty of 15 seconds will be given;

If the athlete has gained a major advantage a disqualification (DSQ) will be imposed;

Should a buoy be missed as a result of a collision in group









racing during a turn this will be investigated and the boat that caused the collision will be penalised or disqualified (DSQ). The athlete who missed the buoy due to collision will not be penalised.

3. Collision or damage:

Any athlete who is considered by a Course Umpire or Race Official to have been responsible for a collision, or who damages the kayak or paddle of another athlete or unnecessarily deviates from the direct racing line or deliberately blocks the path of an athlete may be penalized or disqualified;

A collision will be considered to be an event where an athlete's boat or paddle touches another athlete's boat or paddle in a way that disadvantages another athlete;

If it is considered that other paddlers have only had some minor disadvantages compare to other athletes as a result of the incident the responsible athlete will get a time penalty of 30 seconds;

If it is considered that the incident has given other paddlers a major unfair disadvantage the penalty will be disqualification (DSQ).

4.Boat scrutineering infringement:

Should an athlete/crew have completed a race in a boat which is shown upon inspection does not conform with the ICF rules will be disqualified (DSQ) from the race.

5. Any athlete who is accompanied along the course by other boats which are not in the race will be disqualified (DSQ) from the race.

6. Time penalties as decided by the Chief Course Umpire are not subject to appeal and must be taken at the earliest opportunity during the race; Time penalties must be executed in a designated area at the portage and supervised by a Race Official or will be added to the athletes finishing time if a time penalty

stop is not used in the competition; Disqualifications are decided by the Competition Committee and are subject to an appeal.
7.All penalties or disqualifications must be confirmed by the Competition Committee in writing immediately, giving the reasons. The Team Leader of the athlete/team must acknowledge the receipt on the notice copy with the exact time, which marks the start of the protest time.

8.If an athlete is observed by an International Official to throw a drink bag or other plastic items which then goes into the water, they will receive a 30 second penalty. The decision is to be confirmed by the Chief Course Umpire and cannot be the subject of an appeal.

4.1.2.2 Protests

A protest against the right of an athlete/crew to compete in a race must be addressed to the Chief Official and handed to the Competition Committee, not later than one (1) hour before the start of the race of the competition.

A protest made during a competition must be in a written form, addressed to the Chief Official and handed to the Competition Committee not later than 30 minutes after the last of the athletes involved in the incident has completed the course or Retire from the race.

If the protest is against a decision of the Competition Committee, the protest must be received not later than 30 minutes after the Team Leader is called to attend the Competition Committee to receive the written disqualification.

All protests must be accompanied by a fee of 75 Euros (or an equal sum in the local currency). The fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld.

The decision of the Competition Committee on a protest should be reported to the Team Leaders concerned within 30 minutes of the protest being received.



4.2 Dragon Boat

4.2.1 Format

Dragon Boats must be propelled solely by means of a single-bladed paddle and paddled in sitting position. For 200m and









500m races- The division of the boats into heats should be determined by drawing lots. The race course must be straight and in one direction. There must be at least six lanes. The 2000m race is a pursuit race where the boats start one by one according to the boat numbers at intervals of 10 seconds between each-other. The course is circular with movement direction "anticlockwise". There should be two turning points: one (1) – in finish line zone, and the other – in 500m mark zone. The Start and the Finish of the race should be in front of the Finish Tower.

4.2.2 Competition Rules

The dragon boat events will be organized in accordance with the latest ICF competition rules. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be regarded as authoritative.

4.2.2.1 Disqualifications

Any athlete who attempts to compete in a race by any other than honourable means, or who breaks the racing rules, or who disregards the honourable nature of the racing rules will be disqualified from the race concerned (DSQ).

All penalties or disqualifications must be confirmed by the Competition Committee in writing immediately, giving the reasons. The Team Leader of the athlete/team must acknowledge the receipt on the notice copy.

Failure to deliver the copy confirmation of the disqualification to the Team Leader does not invalidate the disqualification.

The Competition Committee may discipline any athlete or Official whose behaviour is detrimental to the good order and conduct of the competition. The Competition Committee may disqualify him/her for that competition.

In case of disqualification of an athlete due to a doping offense

the complete crew must be disqualified (DQB).

4.2.2.2 Protests and appeals

4.2.2.2.1.Protests

A protest against the right of a crew to compete in a race must be addressed to the Chief Official and handed to the Competition Committee, not later than one (1) hour before the start of the first race of the competition.

A protest made during a competition must be in written form, addressed to the Chief Official and handed to the Competition Committee.

If the protest is against a decision of the Competition Committee, the protest must be received not later than 20 minutes after the decision has been published at athlete's area notice board with exact time of publication.

The Competition Committee must note the time that the decision has been published at athlete's area notice board on the written disqualification.

All protests must be accompanied by a fee of 75 Euros (or an equal sum in the local currency)

The fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld. When a protest or a report is made against an athlete or a team, the Team Leader of the athlete/team in question should be presented the protest or report to read.

4.2.2.2.Appeals

A protest against the right of a crew to compete in a race must be addressed to the Chief Official and handed to the Competition Committee, not later than one (1) hour before the start of the first race of the competition.

A protest made during a competition must be in written form, addressed to the Chief Official and handed to the Competition Committee.

If the protest is against a decision of the Competition Commit-









tee, the protest must be received not later than 20 minutes after the decision has been published at athlete's area notice board with exact time of publication.

The Competition Committee must note the time that the decision has been published at athlete's area notice board on the written disqualification.

All protests must be accompanied by a fee of 75 Euros (or an equal sum in the local currency). The fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld.

When a protest or a report is made against an athlete or a team, the Team Leader of the athlete/team in question should be presented the protest or report to read.



4.3 Canoe Polo

4.3.1 Competition Format

- 1.Two groups of four teams. Single Round-robin games in both groups. All teams qualify for crossed quarter-finals.
- 2.Losing quarter-finalists match-up in a consolation round.
- 3. Winners of consolation round compete for 5th position, losing teams compete for 7th.
- 4. Winners of quarter-finals qualify for the semi-finals.

5.Losing Semi-finalists compete for Bronze, winning semi-finalists compete for Gold and Silver.

4.3.2 Competition Rules

In case of doubt, British English written language is the recognized language for all communication relating to these competition rules and the conduct of all canoeing international competitions.

Any word which may imply the masculine gender also includes the feminine.

4.3.2.1 Scoring

- 1.If any team is disqualified from a game or the competition the Competition Committee will decide the appropriate action.
- 2. The teams in a group will be ranked in order according to the number of points each has gained in playing the league games, the team with the most points being ranked first.
- 3. Three (3) points are awarded for a win, one (1) point for a draw, and zero (0) points for a loss. Where a team is unable to play a game or forfeits a game, they will be awarded no points and the score will be recorded as a 7-0 loss for the forfeiting team.
- 4. Where two (2) or more teams have gained the same number of points, they will be ranked in order according to the following procedures:
- Goal difference.
- Total number of Goals scored.
- Results of game between the two (2) teams within that group.
- Honourable Play (Lowest score of cards received by each team:

Ejection Red Card 25 points.

Progression sanction cards - green, yellow and red cards five (5) points each).









Play Off, if possible.

Honourable Play (Lowest score of cards received by each team:

5.Goal difference: Overall Goals Scored minus Overall Goals Conceded.

6.If one (1) team has had a game conceded to them by another team, and a further team on the same points have actually played this conceding team, then both of these results will be discounted for this differentiation.

4.3.2.2 Sanctions/Disqualification

4.3.2.2.1 Sanctions

- 1. The Referee can impose any combination of the following sanctions for illegal-play depending on the severity and/or frequency of offences being penalised.
- 2. The sanctions available to the Referees are free throws, free shots, goal penalty shots and sanction cards.
- 3. The following definitions should be used when determining which sanction to impose:
- Deliberate foul: a foul where no effort was made to avoid the illegal play. A player's first (1st) deliberate foul will be indicated by the referee showing the player's number, directly after the signal for the foul.
- Dangerous foul: is significant contact with the opponent's arm, head or body that may result in personal injury and is illegal.
- Significant contact: any hard contact that may result in equipment damage or personal injury.
- The act of passing or shooting: begins when a player has the ball in their hand, or balancing on their paddle, and is clearly attempting to pass the ball to a teammate or shoot at goal.
- A near certain goal: The Referee must be certain that a goal was the most likely end result if play had continued.

- Control of the ball: A player is considered to have control of the ball if that player is in possession of the ball or is the nearest player to the ball and is within three (3) metres of the ball on the water.
- Team possession: a team is considered to have team possession and therefore be the attacking team if any member of that team has possession or control of the ball.

Goal Penalty Shot:

- 1. Inside the six (6) metre area, a goal penalty shot will be awarded for any deliberate or dangerous foul on a player in the act of shooting.
- 2.Inside the six (6) metre area, a goal penalty shot will be awarded for any deliberate or dangerous foul on a player in the act of passing or positioning for a near-certain goal.
- 3.Inside the six (6) metre area, a goal penalty shot will be awarded for a deliberate or dangerous foul on a player who is attempting to take a free shot.
- 4.Outside the six (6) metre area, a goal penalty shot will be awarded for any deliberate or dangerous foul on a player in the act of shooting for a near-certain goal while the goal is not defended.
- 5.Outside the six (6) metre area, a goal penalty shot will be awarded for any deliberate or dangerous foul on a player in the act of passing or positioning for a near-certain goal while the goal is not defended.

Free Shot:

- 1.A free shot can be a direct shot at goal.
- 2.A free shot will be awarded for any foul on a player unless a goal penalty shot is awarded.

Free Throw:

- 1.A free throw cannot be a direct shot at goal.
- 2.A free throw will be awarded for any ball out of play, or when









a goal penalty shot, or free shot has not been awarded.

3.Infringement incurs a sanction and the opposition is awarded a free throw. Signals 11 and 14 apply. Sideline throws, goal line throws, corner throws and centre restarts are considered to be free throws.

Ejection Red Card:

- 1.A player is sent off for the rest of the game and cannot be replaced. Signal 20 with red card and verbal statement "ejection red" to the player applies.
- 2.An Ejection Red Card must be awarded if a personal attack on a player occurs or if a player receives a red card (following green and yellow) and it is disputed.
- 3.An Ejection Red Card should be awarded for a repeated deliberate or dangerous foul, that in the Referee's opinion is of major influence to the game or injures/ risked injury to another player.
- 4.A player receiving an Ejection Red Card during a competition will automatically receive one (1) game suspension and be unable to take part in the next game in that competition.
- 5.An Ejection Red Card will be awarded to any player, coach or team official who approaches or talks to any referee or game official in a threatening, abusive or aggressive way during or after a game while in the field of play or competition area.

Green, Yellow and Red Sanction Cards

- 1.A sanction card will be awarded to a player who commits a repeated deliberate foul OR a deliberate foul which has a significant influence on the game.
- 2.A sanction card will be awarded to a player who commits a dangerous foul that results in significant contact by their own kayak, paddle or body with the opponent's arm, head or body that may result in personal injury to the opponent or damage to their equipment.

- 3.A sanction card will be awarded to the offending player who commits a deliberate OR dangerous foul for which the Referee awards a goal penalty shot.
- 4.A sanction card will be awarded for a deliberate OR dangerous foul that is repeated while the Referees are playing advantage unless an Ejection Red Card is awarded. A sanction card awarded after the referee(s) have played advantage will take effect from when the sanction card is awarded, not from when the foul occurred.
- 5.A sanction card will be awarded for any deliberate contact with the kayak of an opponent who is trying to take a free shot, corner, side-line or goal line throw.
- 6.A sanction card will be awarded for repeated and continuous disputing of Referee's decisions.
- 7.A sanction card will be awarded for foul or abusive language directed at an opponent or official.
- 8.A sanction card will be awarded to a player, for unnecessary verbal communication directed at a Referee, official or opponent, or any other unsporting behaviour except where an Ejection Red Card is awarded.
- 9.Players sent off must obey the rules of entry to the playing area for re-entry at the completion of the send-off period.

Restart after a sanction

1. The player taking any goal line throw, corner throw, sideline throw, free throw or free shot must be in the correct position and stationary before taking the throw. The player must clearly hold the ball stationary for a moment above shoulder level to indicate they are taking the throw. The players initial throw must travel one (1) metre measured horizontally from point of release by the player or change possession to another player of the same team. Infringement incurs a sanction with the opposing team being awarded possession of the ball. Signals 11 and









14 apply.

- 2. When taking any free throw, or free shot, the player taking the free throw or free shot must be allowed to take up their position to take the throw. No opponent may prevent the player taking up their position or contact the player or their equipment, or deliberately prevent or restrict the movement of the player taking the throw until the ball is back in play. Infringement occurs a sanction Signals 1 and 15 or 16 apply.
- 3. The ball is not in play until it has travelled one (1) metre measured horizontally from point of release by the player or changed possession to another player of the same team. The opposition must not attempt to prevent the ball from travelling one (1) metre measured horizontally or changing possession. Infringement incurs a sanction. Signals 1 and 15 or 16 apply. The only exception will be for Free Shots awarded within two (2)metres of the goal: Defenders (including the goalkeeper) will be allowed to block the free shot after release, but before it has travelled 1 metre from the point of release, with a stationary paddle or stationary hand(s). All defender's paddles and hands must be kept out of arms reach and any movement towards the player taking the free shot by either a paddle or hand(s), or blocking the ball before it has been released will be deemed a deliberate action and result in a goal penalty shot being awarded.
- 4. The player must throw the ball within five (5) seconds of being in possession and in a position to take the throw. The five 5. seconds for the restart applies from when any member of the team is in a position to pick up the ball and take the throw. Any dropping or fumbling of the ball will not be considered, provided the initial throw is taken within the five (5) seconds. Infringement incurs a sanction with the opposing team awarded possession of the ball. Signals 11 and 14 applies.

5.Following an infringement that led to the awarding of a free shot or free throw, the Referee will indicate where the free shot or free throw will be taken. The free shot or free throw will be taken: either where the infringement occurred, or where the ball was at the time of the infringement, or where the ball landed if it was in flight at the time of the infringement, whichever most advantages the team.

Taking a goal penalty shot

- 1.Definition
- -A Goal Penalty Shot (GPS) is a shot at goal between one (1) attacking player and one (1) goalkeeper.
- -No other player can take any part in the play until the shot at goal is attempted.
- -General play will resume after the shot at goal has been attempted.
- 2. The player taking the goal penalty shot will be stationary with their body on the four (4) metre line.
- 3. The goalkeeper of the defending team will be in position under the goal frame with their body within one (1) metre of the centre of the goal. The goalkeeper must remain stationary in this position until after the shot is taken. Infringement will result in the penalty being retaken.
- 4.All other players and their equipment must be positioned behind the six (6) metre line. Only substitutes or players sent off may be behind the goal line. Entry into the six (6) metre area before the Goal Penalty Shot is taken will result in the penalty being retaken if not scored and a sanction card to the offending player(s).
- 5. The shot will be taken when Referee blows the whistle. The five (5) second rule applies. When the Referee blows the whistle, the player taking the goal penalty must shoot from a stationary position. No presentation of the ball is required.









- 6.General Play will resume for all players on the field once the ball has left the hand of the player taking the penalty.
- 7. The player taking the shot can play the ball again if the shot is blocked by the keeper or rebounds off the goal frame back into the field of play.
- 8. The person committing the foul that caused the penalty must be given a sanction card (or direct red if appropriate).
- 4.3.2.2.2 Disqualification
- 1.Disqualified for Serious Unsportsmanlike Behaviour (DQB)" indicates a disqualification due to a serious breach of the applicable rules or regulations issued by the ICF or the governing body responsible for the competition, or a violation of the World Anti-Doping Code.
- 2.For disqualification after competition caused by doping or ineligibility the following must be completed:
- Deletion of all achieved results and rankings of boat(s) / board(s) (DQB);
- Re-calculation of all results accordingly;
- Production of the revised version of all affected outputs (results, summaries, medals).
- 4.3.2.3 Protests and appeals and delay procedures

4.3.2.3.1 APPEAL TO THE ICF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 1.A participating National Federation can appeal to the ICF Board of Directors if, after the end of the competition, new facts become known that would substantially affect a decision made at the competition.
- 2.Matters of fact during the competition cannot be contested in an appeal.
- 3.An appeal to the ICF Board of Directors must be submitted within 30 days following the end of the competition accompanied by a fee of 75 Euros. The fee will be refunded if the appeal is upheld.

4. The ICF Board of Directors makes its decision and addresses it in writing to the National Federation.

4.3.2.3.2 PROTEST TO COMPETITION COMMITTEE

- 1.A Team Leader may lodge a protest in accordance with these rules. Such protests must be made to, and determined by, the Competition Committee. The Competition Committee may permit a protest to be made by two (2) or more Team Leaders jointly where in the Competition Committee's opinion their grievance arises out of the same decision.
- 2.Objections about scrutineering decisions may be made verbally without fee by a Team Leader to a Scrutineer or the Chief Scrutineer before or during a game in which the equipment is involved. If the objection is made before the game, the equipment may be re-scrutinised. If a scrutineering objection is made during a game the Scrutineer will decide whether the Referee should call the player in to have their equipment inspected.
- 3.All decisions of the Referees on questions of fact are final and their interpretation of the rules must be obeyed throughout the game. No protest can be made in relation to an interpretive decision of a Referee.
- 4. Any protest must be made:
- Within twenty (20) minutes after the game of the incident that resulted in the protest, and be accompanied by a fee of 75 Euros which will be refunded if the protest is upheld;
- Not later than one (1) hour before the start of the game where the protest is against the right of a player or team to participate in a game and be accompanied by a fee of 75 Euros which will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
- 5. The Team Leader (or his/her representative) must make the notice of protest to the Chief Official in writing setting out:
- The incident in question
- The grounds upon which the protest is made









- The reasons or circumstances supporting the alleged grounds of protest.
- 6.Nothing in the rules prevents the withdrawal of a protest by a Team Leader at any time by writing to the Chief Official.
- 7.On receipt of a protest in accordance with the rules, the Chief Official must immediately forward the notice of protest and any accompanying documents to the Competition Committee.
- 8. The Competition Committee will, as soon as practical after receiving a protest, investigate and consider the protest and should within ten (10) minutes of receiving such notice determine whether:
- The protest should be dismissed, because in its determination, the protest is trifling in nature or has no merit
- The protest warrants further review and determination in accordance with these rules.
- 9.If the Competition Committee determines the matter warrants further review in accordance with these rules, it should as soon as practicable, having regard to the proximity of relevant events, call a meeting of the Competition Committee.
- 10. When a protest is made against a player or a team, the Team Leader of the player or team in question will be presented with a copy of the protest to read.
- 11. The Competition Committee may conduct a meeting (or any adjournment it permits) in such manner as it sees fit, but should:
- Give to the protesting Team Leader the opportunity to be heard
- Give due consideration to any statement given by the protesting Team Leader and any relevant official
- Allow the protesting Team Leader to be present along with their representative
- May request or require the protesting Team Leader or any oth-

- er witness to attend the meeting or provide such evidence as is available
- Give the Team Leader (or their representatives) of any team that may be directly affected by the protest every opportunity to be heard
- 12. Following consideration of all relevant and available information, the Competition Committee must arrive at a finding. A decision of the Competition Committee can be by a majority decision. The Competition Committee may:
- Disqualify a team or exclude them from further competition.
- Where eligibility protest against a team is upheld, disqualify the team from the competition. When a team is disqualified, insofar as is possible, the results of all previous games the team has played in the competition will be nullified or awarded to their opponents, as appropriate. Any awards of medals, trophies or placing will be rescinded.
- Take such other action as it thinks fit and, in each case, must give written reasons for its decision.
- 13. The Chief Official will then immediately notify the protesting Team Leader and all other relevant people of the Competition Committee's decision in writing.

4.3.5.2 Uniforms

- 1.All players of the same team must have kayaks with decks of the same colour, spray decks of the same colour, outmost body covering of the same colour, helmets of the same colour and shirts of the same colour.
- 2.If the Referee or Scrutineer determines there is inadequate distinction between the teams, the first named team on the game sheet will be required to change their body identification colours.
- 3. The players of a team can use numbers from 1 to 99. This number must be displayed on the body covering and on the helmet. Players may choose to have their family name on the rear of their body covering. This family name may be above or below their number but must be in the same position for the whole team.
- 4. The numbers will be clearly legible to the Referees from anywhere on the field and must clearly individually identify each









player in a team. A number at least 20 cm high must be on the back of the body. A number at least 10 cm height must be on the front of the body. Numbers at least 7.5 cm high must be on each side of the helmet. The captain of each team must be distinguished from the rest of the team by an armband.


