

Entries

The Host Organising Committee (HOC) must issue a bulletin to all Federations clearly advising of all the entry details (competition dates, events contested, age groups, race format) and the entry process.

All entries for the World Championships, World Cups and ICF Ranking races must be done by the Athletes Federation via the ICF online entry system SDP.

The HOC should work with the ICF HQ staff to confirm the entry system is established for their event with the correct closing date and associated information.

The HOC may request an entry download from the ICF prior to the close of entries but will receive the final version once entries close.

The online SDP system is closed at this time so that late entries cannot be processed via the online system but must follow the late entry process, see below.

Federations may receive a receipt of their entries directly from the SDP system.

The HOC may only accept entries from member Federations of the ICF. Any non member Federation wishing to enter should be referred to the ICF Office. Two weeks prior to the World Championships, after the close of entries, the ICF will forward to the HOC a list of current member Federations.

Each Federation is permitted to enter;

- World Championships and World Cups – up to 3 boats per National Federation per event
- ICF Ranking Races – up to the number allowed by the HOC but is a minimum of 6 boats per National Federation per event

The final acceptance of entries occurs at the Official Team Leader Meeting and entries not confirmed by Team Leaders at this time will be removed from the start list.

Late Entries

In extraordinary circumstances, an application can be made to the CSL Technical Committee Chair for the acceptance of late nominal /numerical entries from Federations (CSL Rule 1.6.1f)

If the entry is accepted, then it should be forwarded to the ICF HQ to process the entry.

Entry and Start Lists

Following close of entries an “entry list” ideally without published start times should be produced and posted and Team Leaders should be requested to check and confirm that the entries are correct for their team.

Prior to the Official Team Leaders meeting the provisional start list, with no bib numbers included should be produced and published to Team Leaders.

The Official Start list (including bib numbers) should be produced directly following the Team Leader meeting.

Any changes to this final start list must comply with CSL Rule 6.3.
