Officially inaugurated on December 23, 2015, the park has since become the home of Brazil's elite canoe slalom team, featuring a course recognized as one of the finest in the world.

It offers a wide range of sporting and recreational activities for local residents, preserving a lasting Olympic legacy while promoting health, engagement, and access to world-class facilities.



Deodoro Artificial Canoe Slalom Channel – Technical Overview

The **Deodoro Artificial Canoe Slalom Course**, located in Deodoro Olympic Park, Rio de Janeiro, is a world-class venue for canoe slalom and kayak cross.

- **Length:** 270 meters
- **Width:** 12–15 meters
- **Vertical Drop:** 4 meters
- **Water Flow:** 12 m³/s
- **Rapid Classification:** Sections rated Class II–III.

The Kayak Cross starting ramp will be set up for training from 20/01/2026.
